SAN FRANCISCO, CA (December 5, 5:00pm) Mr. Arthur Chan, Honorary President of the American Teo Chew Business Association, generously donated \$500,000 to the Chinese Hospital at an official check presentation ceremony on December 5th in support of its 1979 building renovation project and development. He has been generous not just through financial gifts but with his time, to advocate for Chinese Hospital in the community. Mr. Chan is also a mentor and role model to me personally. He is an outstanding community leader. We are deeply appreciative of Mr. Chan’s generosity and his commitment in supporting Chinese Hospital,” said Dr. Zhang.

The Chinese Hospital is one of the few remaining independent community hospitals, and the only hospital in the country that is dedicated to serving primarily the Chinese community. In order to provide better services to our Community, Chinese Hospital is renovating the 1979 building and expanding and upgrading its services, including its same day surgery center, gastrointestinal laboratory, multispecialty clinic, as well as infusion center for chemotherapy and blood transfusion. The new gift of \$500,000 from Mr. Chan is especially noteworthy, to continue to help improve community access to a spectrum of services that the new Chinese Hospital offers.
